Guest Lecture on "Xenobiotic Compounds"

Xenobiotic compounds are man-made chemicals that are present in the environment at unnaturally high concentrations. The xenobiotic compounds are either not produced naturally, or are produced at much lower concentrations than man. Microorganism has the capability of degrading all naturally occurring compounds.


