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VISIT TO GOVERNMENT PRIMARY SCHOOL SANJAULI SHIMLA Collaborating Agency: Community No. of Participants: 7 Organizing Unit: Department of Nutrition & Health Education

On the 5th of August 2019, a visit was conducted to Government Primary School Sanjauli in Shimla.

Objective: The primary objectives of the visit were to assess the anthropometric measurements of the children, including their height, weight, mid-upper circumference, and calculate their body mass index (BMI) and to gather information about the government feeding policy running in the school.

During the visit, the students participated in learning how to measure the height, weight, and mid-upper circumference of children. Trained personnel guided them in performing these measurements accurately.

After this there was a discussions session with the school authorities and staff to get a deeper understanding of the government feeding program, the frequency of meals, its nutritional value and the overall impact of the program on the students' health and well-being.

Outcome: As a result of the visit, the students acquired practical knowledge on how to measure anthropometric parameters such as height, weight, mid-upper circumference, and calculate BMI. They also got valuable insights into the effectiveness of the feeding program.

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NUTRITIONAL ASSESSMENT OF PREGNANT WOMEN Collaborating Agency: Community No. of Participants :3 Organizing Unit: Department of Nutrition & Health Education

On February 28, 2022, nutritional assessment program for pregnant women was organized by the department of Nutrition and Health Education, St. Bede's College, Shimla.

Objective: The purpose was to learn about diet and to check if they were healthy during their pregnancies.

The students asked them to remember what they ate and drank in the last 24 hours. They measured their weight, height, and arm size to evaluate their BMI.

Outcome: The students learned how to conduct dietary surveys for pregnant women and use the 24-hour dietary recall method to collect information about their food. They examined the diet chart of pregnant women and planned a healthy diet for them containing nutrients like folic acid, iron, calcium, and protein.

Objective: The main aim was to assess the anthropometric measurements of preschoolers, particularly their weight and height to find their growth patterns and nutritional status.

Outcome: As a result of the assessment, the students acquired practical skills in measuring the weight and height of preschoolers accurately. They learned how to use measuring instruments and techniques appropriately to gather precise data.

The students also understood the functioning of Anganwadi's and the feeding program running in schools. They concluded that nutritious meals could help preschoolers grow and develop.

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NUTRITIONAL ASSESSMENT OF PREGNANT AND LACTATING WOMEN Collaborating Agency: Community No. of Participants:7 Organizing Unit: Department of Nutrition & Health Education

On 7thSeptember 2022 the department of Nutrition and Health Education organized a community outreach program where the students visited pregnant and lactating women to know their nutritional status and take anthropometric measurements.

Objectives: 1. To know the role of a dietician in a hospital.

2. To find how nutrition is vital for pregnant and nursing women.

3. To make students acquire skills to make a diet plan for pregnant and nursing women.

During the activity, the role of a dietician in a hospital was thoroughly explained to the students. They learned that dieticians assess the nutritional needs of patients based on their medical conditions, dietary restrictions, and personal preferences. They work closely with the medical team to design individualized meal plans that support the patients' overall health goals and aid in their recovery process.

The importance of nutrition for pregnant and lactating women was emphasized. The students gained insights into the unique nutritional requirements of these women during these crucial stages. They learnt that the growth and development of a baby and even the health of the mother during pregnancy and breastfeeding depends on these nutrients.

To enhance their practical skills, the students were guided on how to plan a well-balanced diet for pregnant and lactating women. They learnt about the essential nutrients required during these stages, appropriate food choices, portion control, and meal planning strategies. Case studies and practical examples were utilized to demonstrate the application of this knowledge in real-life scenarios.

Result: After the activity, the students had a clear understanding of what dietitians do in hospitals and why nutrition is crucial for pregnant and nursing women.

On November 21, 2022, an educational session was organized with a clear objective: to provide students with knowledge about malnutrition, methods to assess nutritional status, and the significance of national programs in tackling this issue. **Objectives:**

 Understand what malnutrition is and how it affects individuals and communities.
 Gain insight into national programs and guidelines designed to combat malnutrition and promote better health outcomes.

During the session, the students understood the meaning, causes and consequences of malnutrition. Various methods for assessing nutritional status were explained. Students also learned about growth charts and reference standards to identify signs of malnutrition.

The national and international policies to combat malnutrition were also discussed. They learned about initiatives like promoting exclusive breastfeeding, food fortification, and school feeding programs. Additionally, students explored the role of nutrition education and counseling in improving nutritional outcomes.

Outcome: By the end of the session, students acquired knowledge about malnutrition, its impact, and assessment methods of nutritional status, especially in preschoolers. They also acquired practical skills in accurately measuring weight and height, enabling them to evaluate the nutritional status of young children.
