CAMPUS TOUR: ORIENTATON

Date: September 9, 2023

Objective: To familiarise first-year M.A. students with their college campus while exploring its rich cultural heritage and facilities.

Description:

The Department of English organised an Orientation-cum-Campus Tour on September 9, 2023. Second-year M.A. students, along with the faculty, Ms. Annette James, familiarised students with the syllabus and other particulars of the course, following which a campus tour commenced. The campus tour began with second-year students guiding the first-year students on a tour of various facilities like the Common Room, Gym, Library, etc. Following this, the students received a tour of the campus' lush deodar trees and other flora and fauna. The tour's highlight was visiting our heritage building – Marian Block. Students watched the wooden interiors of the building with great awe as Sr. Sylvia led the tour through this building, which was established in 1904 and has artefacts dating back to the 19th century. The tour ended with students congregating near the chapel on campus and discussing their hopes for the course.

- The first-year students became familiar with the various facilities available on campus.
- The event served as a good ice-breaker between students from both years.
- Students became aware of the rich heritage, flora and fauna on campus.

Date: September 12, 2023


Objective: To create awareness about the recent trends of competitive exams among students.


The session came to an end with a discussion on various approaches that the students can follow.

Description:

Objective: To celebrate the art of letter writing and express thoughts, feelings, and ideas meaningfully.


Description:

The students of St. Bede's College participated in the National Level Letter Writing Competition organised by the Department of Posts, Government of India. About 150 students from UG and PG courses participated in this competition. The theme given to the students was 'Digital India'. The Department of Posts provided students with inland letters as well as envelopes. The letters were to be addressed to the Chief Postmaster General. Shortlisted students would be given cash prizes and become eligible for the next round.

It was a proud moment for St. Bede's College as two students won prizes at the Circle Level and proceeded into the next round. Palak Negi, B.A. III English Honours bagged the first prize and received a cash prize of Rs. 25000. Ayushi from M.A. English won the third prize and was conferred with a cash prize of Rs. 10,000. Students were given prizes on 12th February 2024 by the Department of Posts, Government of India.

- Students got a platform to display their writing skills and talents at a National Level.
- Students were able to understand the art of letter writing.
- Students gained confidence in their writing skills, especially the prize winners.

WORKSHOP ON THE BASICS OF MLA FORMAT

Date: March 4, 2024

Objective: To introduce students to the basics of the MLA Stylesheet format.

Description:

The Department of English organised a workshop on the basics of MLA format for first-year PG students to introduce them to the basics of academic writing. The workshop, conducted by Ms. Annette James, Department of English, St. Bede's College, Shimla, gave students new insight into academia, focusing on credibility and readability. A handout was given to each student, and the basic details of how and why to follow these formats were discussed.

Outcomes:

- Students learn to ensure their writing is navigable, readable and credible.
- Students discovered the beginnings of academic writing.
- Students started submitting their assignments in the prescribed format.

Date: March 13, 2024


Objective: To emphasise the importance of citing and referencing while enlightening students about the perils of plagiarism.


Description:

- Students learnt various ways to ensure that their work maintains academic credibility.



Description:

WORKSHOP ON BASICS OF PHONETICS

Date: April 24, 2024

Objective: To introduce students to the basics of phonetics, a fundamental part of understanding linguistics.

Description:

The Department of English organised a workshop on the Basics of Phonetics for PG students. The resource person for the Event was Dr. Suneela Sharma. The workshop was conducted to encourage PG students to understand the basics of English phonetics from a linguistic edge rather than a literary or historical perspective. They learnt the basics of IPA symbols, their use, and how to transcribe them. They also learnt about the organs of speech, their uses, and how sounds are produced across various languages.

- Students were given a deeper insight into a new discipline of study Phonetics and Linguistics.
- Students learnt various ways in which language functions phonetically.
- They learnt the importance of stress, tones and various other factors in producing consonant and vowel sounds across languages.
- Students learnt how to transcribe words phonetically.
