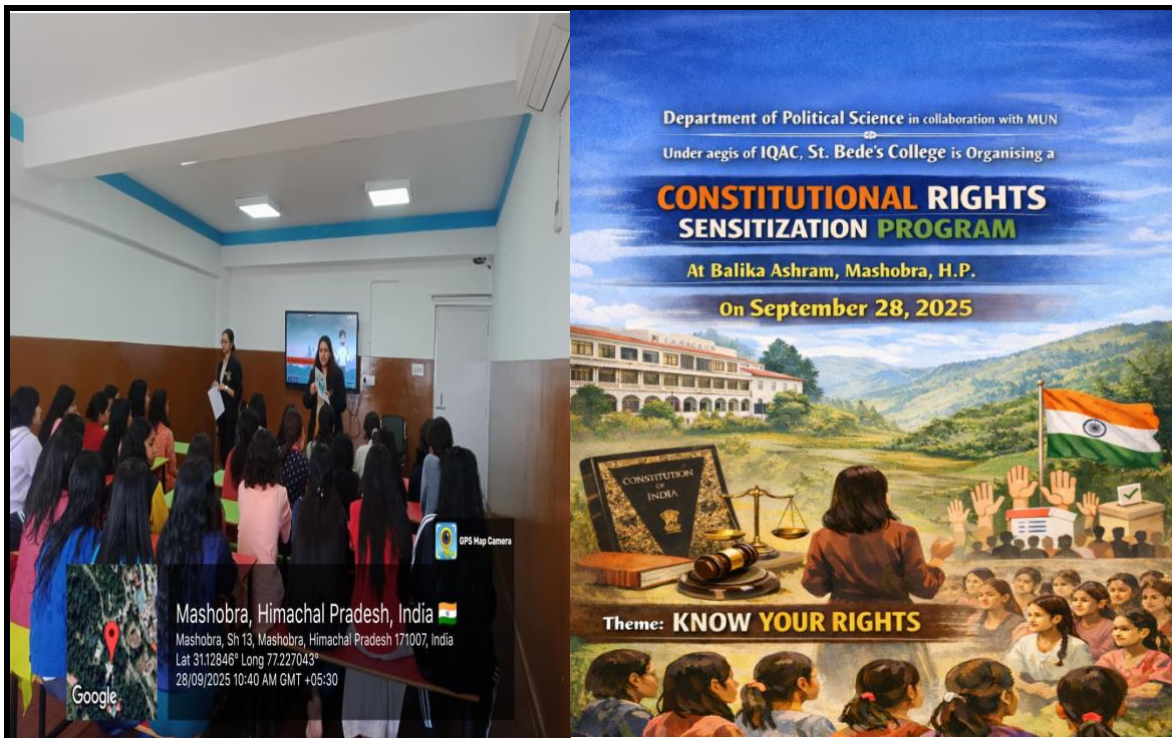
**OUTCOME:**

First Prize: Kritika Verma, BA 3rd Year

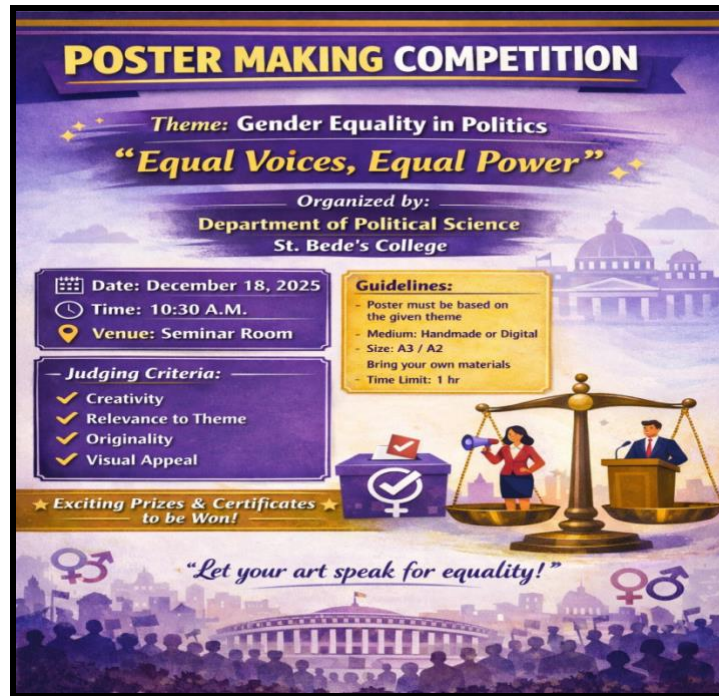
Second Prize: Priya, BA 2nd Year

Third Prize: Muskan Rohal, BA 2nd Year

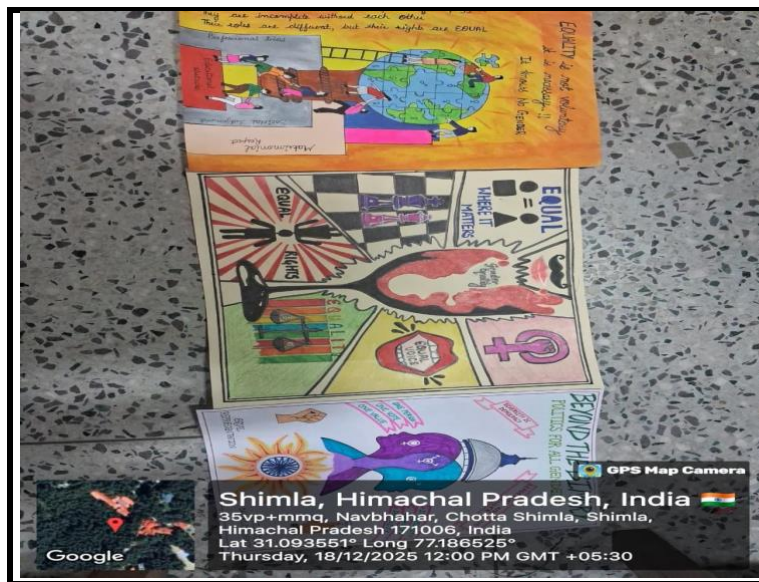
Overall, the competition was a meaningful and successful academic activity.
